With a win at districts last week, the cast and crew of the Wauneta-Palisade High School One-Act play, "How to Kiss a Girl," travelled to Norfolk Tuesday for the State Championship held Wednesday for Class D2.

It is the school's fourth trip to the State Championships. WP has brought home a trophy from each previous trip, as the Class D1 runner up in 1997 and 1999 and winning Class C2 in 2001.

WP also faced and beat qualifiers Ravenna in Class C1 and York in Class B at Gothenburg in November.

Chase County qualified for State in Class C1.

Liz Noler said the students were extremely excited to win Districts and have worked very hard to make it back to state.

At Districts, WP beat runner-up Wallace by 15 points, 174 to 159.
