

## Storm sirens sound in Wauneta Tuesday night

Following an afternoon of threatening storm clouds and warnings broadcast across the air waves Wauneta felt the brunt of a damaging storm front and series of thunderstorms that moved through the area Tuesday night into Wednesday morning.

Around 6:30 p.m. Tuesday, tornado warnings sounded in Wauneta after Doppler radar detected rotation in the storm clouds sweeping overhead as they moved along a southeasterly trek as cooler weather moved in from Canada.

Hail stones pounded Wauneta at various times throughout the evening accompanied by high winds and rain.

Hail and storm damage of varying degrees reached nearly every pocket of western Nebraska the first few days of this week, with the western portions of Chase and Dundy counties especially hard hit on Monday. An area between Wauneta and Hamlet also suffered significant hail damage Monday evening.

Tuesday afternoon and evening another cold front moved through bringing severe damage to the Imperial and McCook areas as well as widespread damage of varying degrees to the rest of the region.

Heavy rains accompanied the series of storms with totals ranging from over an inch of rainfall on Tuesday in the Imperial, Enders and Grafton areas.

In the Wauneta area, .70 an inch reportedly fell Tuesday. Hayes Center and McCook saw rainfall totals approaching 3 inches on Monday.
