Be sure to set your clock back Saturday

It's time to "Fall Back" as daylight saving time ends this weekend. The clock will officially turn back one hour at 2 a.m. Sunday morning. For most of us that means resetting the clocks at home before going to bed Saturday night.

County-wide OOR program offered

Chase County is leading a cooperative effort to provide some needed renovation to homes within the county.

Using funding provided by the Nebraska Department of Economic Development, Chase County has leveraged a partnership with USDA Rural Development to assist families utilizing the program which has helped Wauneta home-owners make improvements to their homes in recent years.

The housing program, referred to as Owner-Occupied Rehab, provides families living at a moderate to low income level who own their homes, a financial resource to complete renovation work such as new windows, doors, siding, roofing, heating systems and insulation.

Where the homeowner falls in the Area Medium Income will determine if the dollar amount of assistance is a "forgivable loan" with no repayment necessary as long as the family maintains the property as their primary residence, or the loan will be paid back over the next 10 years with no interest charged.

Families may qualify for substantial assistance, allowing extensive renovation projects to be

accomplished on their homes. At this time, funding is available for eight families to receive up to \$24,500 in housing assistance.
