According to the Keep Nebraska Beautiful website the Great American Cleanup is the nation’s largest annual cleanup and community improvement event. Event activities are generally accomplished in March, April and May.

The goal of the Great American Cleanup is to stimulate “community pride by involving residents, businesses, and politicians at the state and local level in an effort to improve and beautify their local environment,” as reported on the Keep Nebraska Beautiful website.

Typical Great American Cleanup activities include litter cleanup, recycling events, planting flowers and trees and clothes collections.

“We challenged all communities throughout the state with these two prizes to be given to the top two communities for their overall GAC efforts,” said Polson.

The Village of Wauneta won the gas-powered string trimmer and the Village of Petersburg won the gas-powered backpack leaf blower. Polson commended Wauneta’s accomplishments saying, “Wauneta’s efforts were just outstanding.”

The Wauneta Chamber accepted the award of the trimmer on behalf of the Village Beautification committee chairperson Sharon Walgren said, “We were honored to be chosen as the recipient of this trimmer, especially since there were only two prizes awarded in the state!”

Village of Wauneta representatives were unable to attend the Keep Nebraska Beautiful awards luncheon in Kearney on June 28 when the awards were announced. But, that didn’t stop Polson from telling the crowd of Wauneta’s accomplishments.
