Together they started this journey on May 5, 2013. They plan on being to New York in about 20 or less days.

Lester may be a stranger to our local communities, but not to the sports world.

Lester is a renown athlete. He received ESPN's ESPY award for Best Male Athlete with a Disability.

He has been involved with athletics his whole life. However when he was 12 he was hit by a speeding car that broke 21 bones and collapsed one of his lungs. Lester survived but was left with his right arm paralyzed.

This disability did not stop Lester from going after what he wanted.

Lester has run in many marathons, triathlons, biathlons, and many other competitions and running/endurance events. He once ran 26 marathons in 26 consecutive days.

Lester says he has always wanted to run across America and raising money for Waves for Waters was an opportunity to help others.

When asked how he keeps motivated while running such long distances in hot weather he says, "I try to take the focus off of myself and remember the many inspiring families we are trying to help."
