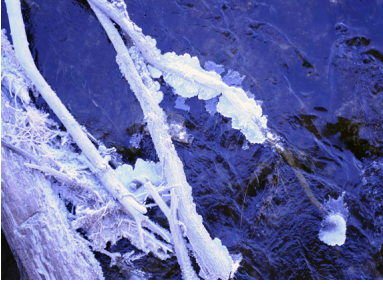


Wind chills not as bad at home as those seen elsewhere in the region

Wind chills in Southwest Nebraska got as low as -23 degrees on Sunday, Jan. 5, according to the National Weather Service, North Platte office. Other areas in the midwest were not as lucky—wind chills in Montana dropped to a low of -63 degrees, according to the National Weather Service. Temperatures in southwest Nebraska are supposed to be a bit warmer for now. The National Weather Service issued a hazardous weather outlook notice Tuesday, stating that a powerful storm with the potential to produce high winds may hit our area on Sunday.
