On the boys’ side, Jacob Maris was first in the 1600 and 3200 meter runs and fifth in the 800. Maris’s 3200 meter time was a personal best.

Wes Anderjaska won the 800 meter run with a personal best time and was sixth in the 1600 meter run.

Hayden Pollmann was fourth in the 400 meter dash, Logan Bischoff was third in the discus and Weylin Davis was fifth in the high jump.

“The boys had a fun meet” Doetker said. “We swept mid-distances and long distances and the boys were very excited.”

Individually for the girls, Emma Skelton finished second in both the 100 and 300 meter hurdles. Abbie Fanning was fourth in the 800 meter run and fifth in the 400 meter run. In field events, Hannah Nordhausen was second in the discus and Taylor Lee was third in the shot put with a PR, and fifth in the discus.

Besides T. Lee, shot putters Ellie Lee, Stephanie Acosta, Nicole Strand and Cassidy Rathe all had personal bests.

Doetker said the girls faced some of the toughest competition in the area.

“They had some disappoints but we’re ready to go and compete hard at the next meet,” she added.
