10 years ago this week

May 24, 2001

Concrete work at the pool was completed over the weekend. Brian Yost, a 1989 WHS graduate, and owner of BK Yost, a construction company in Omaha and longtime friend Steve Kerchal of Culbertson, a 1982 WHS graduate, and owner of Osmose Inc., a utilities contracting company, "gave back" to the community, volunteering themselves and seven members of their work crew. Prep work was done by Barry Hackney and Kelly Doetker, utilities superintendent. Cost to the village was an estimated \$6,000 for the cement. Donation of time and labor by the workers was estimated at \$14,000.

Twila Carter, then 14 years old, recalled hearing of the bombing of Pearl Harbor where two of her brothers, Irvin (Jack) and Cleo (Dutch) were stationed at the time. Five other brothers, Merle, Dale, Carroll, Donald and Dean, sons of Mr. and Mrs. Samuel Clifford Ferguson of Palisade, also went on to serve in WWII. During the proceedings of the 78th United States Congress on April 12, 1943, special recognition was given to the Ferguson family by District I Nebraska U.S. Representative Carl T. Curtis. Their names will also be placed on the new WWII Memorial in Washington D.C.
