#### Sept. 26, 1963

Early settlers can recall the town of Hudson, the predecessor to Hamlet. Hudson was located southwest of present-day Hamlet. Legend has it that in the early days a gold shipment bound for Hudson, Colo., was delivered to Hudson, Neb., by mistake and the local agent stayed up all night waiting for officials to pick it up. Because of the confusion between the two towns, the Nebraska town was later changed to Hamlet sometime after 1900.
